Greetings from MSMF

This year brought us a number of new challenges and new opportunities.

The first batch of grade 7 students from Sarada Vidyalayam wrote the entrance examination for admission into the public schools. The students did very well and they all got into grade 8. Now, we are monitoring these students regularly to see that they remain in the schools and progress well.

Srikiran Institute of Ophthalmology, had completed the implementation of one three year (1997 - 00) project, funded by Help the Aged Canada, the Wild Rose Foundation of Alberta and the Canadian International Development Agency and started another three year (2000 - 03) project, Progressive Elimination of Avoidable Blindness due to Cataract and Glaucoma.

The hospital is overcrowded. The demand for eye care services is increasing and the resources available are not adequate. Just to keep up with the rate of incidence for this region, the current rate of 1000 cataract extractions per month will have to be doubled. To manage glaucoma, another major cause of blindness, we need more resources. A plan is being drawn now for new construction to extend the hospital.

Good news is that we are now eligible for direct funding from CIDA and Canadian donations to MSMF qualify for matching purposes. This recognition by CIDA encourages us all.
