## Eye hospital success story – Yelagala Aadam



Yelagala Aadam is a 60-year-old daily wage earner, who works as an agricultural helper and a stone crusher. Every day he works to support his wife and three daughters.

About 5 years ago, an injury resulted in loss of total vision in his right eye. To make matters worse, his vision in his left eye also started to deteriorate resulting in the inability to recognize objects even at a close distance. Due to these issues, he was unable to work.

He came to a camp conducted by SriKiran Institute of Ophthalmology. Surgery on his left eye at Srikiran Institute of Ophthalmology, improved his vision significantly (Before surgery: LE – 10 ft. After surgery: LE – 20/60).

He has said, "Your hospital is like a temple for the poor and the needy people and I am very thankful to your hospital management and staff forever".

## Eye Hospital Advancements - Retinopathy of Prematurity (ROP)

ROP is a condition that affects premature children leading to vision loss in the long run if not treated. This is caused by an abnormal proliferation of blood vessels in the very premature babies and is usually treated by laser therapy.

Recently, Srikiran Institute of Ophthalmology started a Retinopathy of Prematurity (ROP) Screening program at Government General Hospital, Kakinada.

From September to November a total of 42 babies were screened for ROP and laser treatments were performed on 2 babies.

On 9th September 2014, for the first time in coastal Andhra Pradesh, India, a 1<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>-month-old baby was operated upon for Retinopathy of Prematurity.
